## How to play

Deal 28 cards face up in one row of seven cards, one of six, and so on, down to one card. For convenience the cards may overlap. The 29th card is dealt face up to the centre as a foundation card. As they become available, either from the layout or the hand, the other three cards of the same rank will be placed in line with it.

The object of the game is to build ascending, round-the-corner suit sequences onto the foundation cards.

The bottom card of a column in the layout is termed exposed. It may be built on a foundation or packed on another exposed card in the layout. Within the layout, cards are packed in descending sequences of the same colour (not necessarily of the same suit), but it should be borne in mind that a sequence may be moved from one column to another only as a whole and only if all the

cards of the sequence are of the same suit. If a vacancy occurs through all the cards of a column being moved, it may be filled with any available card, or same-suit sequence of cards, if wished.

After all possible moves have been made, cards are dealt face up to the bottom of all the columns, and the game continues until the stock is exhausted. After the third deal has been made from the stock, there will be two cards left in the hand and these may be played to either a foundation or the layout.

In the illustration, play the \$10 to the foundation row. Pack the \$5 on the \$6 and the \$4 on the \$5. Pack the \$2 on the \$3, and the \$6 on the \$7. Move the \$Q into the vacancy, and pack the \$6, \$5 and \$4 together on the \$7. Pack the \$5 on the \$6 and move the \$7. \$9 and \$4 together into the vacancy. Then deal seven more cards and continue.
